Placerville Pony Express Station Main Street and Sacramento Street Placerville CA 38.7279 -120.8033 Daylight Only



Gold Rush town Placerville was a relay station of the Central Overland Pony Express, April 4, 1860 – June 30, 1861. Here on April 4, 1860 the first east-bound pony rider, William (Sam) Hamilton changed horses, added one express letter to his mochila, and sped away.

#### **PE29 179 points**

Pony Express Marker, Diamond Springs, CA 501 Main Street Diamond Springs CA 38.694 -120.8173 Daylight Only



Diamond Springs was a stop on the Pony Express Trail. In 1960, the National Pony Express Centennial Association commemorated the 100th anniversary of the Pony Express with markers such as this one. The marker is on the monument, directly below the main historical marker.

#### PE30 112 points

DuRoc House Pony Express Station 3441 Durock Road Shingle Springs CA 38.6532 -120.9633 Daylight Only



The "Du Roc House" was only 175 feet due south from this monument on the road from Sacramento to Placerville. Starting on April 3, 1860 the Pony Express used this route between San Francisco and St. Louis, Missouri.

This is the site of the "Pleasant Grove House" Pony Express Station

Fifteen Mile House White Rock Road and Gold Valley Drive Rancho Cordova CA 38.5898 -121.262 Daylight Only



This was the site of the second remount station of the Central Overland Pony Express during March-July 1860. Here on April 4, 1860, Sam (Bill) Hamilton with the first eastward mail of the Pony Express changed ponies with Morman Tavern as his next stop.

Daylight Only



Departing at 2:45 A.M. from the Alta Telegraph Co. in Sacramento, Pony Rider Sam (Bill) Hamilton carried the first mail eastward of the Central Overland Pony Express on April 4, 1860. Here, quickly changing ponies, he sped on to the next stop at Fifteen Mile Station.

Take a picture of the marker on the Sacramento State University Campus at the plaza located at the southern end of the Guy West Footbridge.

#### PE34 252 points

Sacramento Pony Express Statute 2nd Street and J Street Sacramento CA 38.5832 -121.5039 Daylight Only



This statue commemorates the glory of The Pony Express, which started here at 2:46a.m. on April 4,1860, when Sam Hamilton galloped into a blinding rainstorm on the first lap of the 1,966 mile trip to St. Joseph, Missouri.
