The 2017 Iron Butt Rally (IBR) is designed to lead you on a photo safari of North America's iconic animals, both real and imagined. Armed with only your camera and motorcycle, you will roam the wilds in search of these elusive creatures. Fortunately, all of the target creatures are sedentary and quite unlikely to run onto the road.

In this catalog, you will find data on different beasts to hunt. Your goal is to capture a photo and escape before they turn on you.

The animals in the rally book are divided into five categories for your sorting enjoyment:

Air

These majestic birds and insects capture our imagination with their ability to soar above it all and see the world from a different perspective.

Land

From iconic images of native bison to fearsome predators to pets, land animals are symbols of nature, strength, and companionship.

Water

Creatures of ocean, lake, river, and stream, these animals provide food, sport, and in some cases provoke visceral fear.

Prehistoric

Eons ago, giants roamed these lands. You can still find their remnants today if you know where to look.

Mythical

Born of our imagination, whimsy, or a need to explain the unknown, these creatures popped up throughout history. Search out representations of those fanciful ideas.

This keepsake booklet identifies each of the 328 different creature bonuses available on your safari and provides specific directions to document each bonus. Bonus codes are listed alphabetically. Points and leg-specific instructions will be in the Leg Bonus Packs.

All times are local unless otherwise specified.

Unless otherwise specified, rally ID flags are required in all photos.

To earn any bonus, you MUST claim it on the Claimed Bonuses form. This includes Rest bonuses, Call-In bonuses, and Tracking bonuses. If you lose the Claimed Bonuses form, you will earn no bonus points for the leg.

Info on Call-In and Rest bonuses as well as the Checkpoints is at the back of this book.

Take a photo of the metal eagle head.

This large eagle head stands in front of the Besser Museum for Northeast Michigan. It was created by Tom Moran of Moran Iron Works in nearby Onaway, MI.





Arachophilla the Spider Berkman Dr at Manor Rd Austin, TX

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the giant spider.

This twenty-three foot high giant spider is named Arachophilla. It was created by sculptor Dixie Friend Gay.

Take a photo of the Back Bay NWR Visitor Center sign.

Back Bay National Wildlife Refuge was established on June 6, 1938 as a 4,589-acre refuge to provide feeding and resting habitat for migratory birds.

Take a photo of the vultures gutting the car.

Metal vultures are gutting a dead car on the roof of this salvage yard. Be wary they don't turn their hungry eyes towards your motorcycle.

24 hours

Take a photo of The Big Duck building.

The Big Duck is a building in the shape of a duck located in Flanders, New York. It was built in 1931 by duck farmer Martin Maurer in nearby Riverhead and used as a shop to sell ducks and duck eggs.


World's Largest Bee 3rd Ave SE and Range Road 213A Falher, AB

Falher, Alberta is known as the "Honey Capital of Canada". The area produces more than 45 million kg of clover honey per year. This statue was built in 1990 by Richard Ethier for Falher's very first Honey Festival.



Leader Burrowing Owls 4 Ave and 1 St W Leader, SK

Take a photo of the burrowing owls.

The small community of Leader has many sculptures that represent area wildlife. Your challenge is to find the Burrowing Owls at the corner of 1 Street W and 4 Avenue.

Take a photo of the sculpture of a hand and butterfly.

A butterfly alights on a large metal hand in front of Lunsford Welding.

Take a photo of the Vilano Beach bluebird.

This bird from the 1940's was originally orange and promoted the citrus industry. It is now painted blue and transformed into the Bluebird of Happiness, greeting visitors at the Vilano Beach pier.


Coal Mine Canary 219 W Main St Trinidad, CO

"The Coal Miner's Canary" honors mine safety canaries. This bird is shown alive and not dropped off the perch due to carbon monoxide poisoning.

Take a photo of the crow

This huge black crow perches atop a 31-foot long branch. Inside the base is a tiny self-guided museum. Push a button and a prerecorded narration will tell you more than you would ever want to know about this crow.

Take a photo of the large butterfly statue outside the Butterfly House.

The Butterfly House opened in 1998 and is a division of the Missouri Botanical Garden. It is the only dedicated insect facility accredited by the Association of Zoos and Aquariums.

Take a photo of the large mallard.

The tiny town of Andrew, Alberta takes pride in having the "World's Largest" mallard. Two other towns in North America make that same claim. In any case this is one huge mallard.

Take a photo of the stainless steel spider

The owner of Innovative Pest Management wanted to draw attention to the business. They hired local race car designerturned-sculptor Dave Simpson to create this nightmare of a Black Widow spider out of stainless steel.

The community of Wabamun, Alberta holds its annual Dragonfly Festival in June. This dragonfly sculpture is claimed to be the largest in Canada

Take a photo of the large eagle sculpture at E 9th St and Minnesota Ave.

Libby, Montana claims the title of "City of Eagles".

Take a photo of the rooster.

Outside of Carl's Bakery in East Peoria resides a 10 foot tall rooster wearing a hat. This dapper fellow may be world's largest rooster wearing a hat; or it may not.

This memorial is a tribute to environmental activist, actor, and local resident Dennis Weaver. Weaver passed away in 2006. The memorial features a large eagle soaring above a prayer stone stack.

Adirondack Carousel Pavilion Depot St. Saranac Lake, NY

Take a photo of the black fly on the Adirondack Carousel.

Inside the Adirondack Carousel pavilion you will find what is likely to be the only black fly you will ever see on a carousel. The official name of this sculpture is "Bug-Eye".

Paisano Pete the Roadrunner E Dickenson Blvd and N Main St Fort Stockton, TX

Take a photo of Paisano Pete the roadrunner.

Paisano Pete was erected in 1980 in the center of Fort Stockton. It was declared the largest roadrunner in the world at the time. Paisano Pete no longer holds that title but its 11 foot height and 22 foot length are still impressive.

The Mother Goose House 2906 N Main St Hazard, KY

Take a photo of the Mother Goose House.

This stone building was built to resemble a goose sitting on a nest. It was built in 1940 by George Stacy. The goose's eyes are automotive headlights, designed to light up at night.

Take a photo of the golden eagle statue.

The golden eagle statue at Southern Mississippi is titled "Lofty Return". The three-ton eagle sculpture was commissioned by SMU alumni Chuck Scianna and installed in 2013.

Have your photo taken by IBR staff in front of the monstrous grasshopper as part of a group.

Local metal sculptor and retired school teacher Gary Greff created a series of large statues to draw visitors off the interstate and down the "Enchanted Highway". This large grasshopper was erected in the spring 1999. It is considered to be the world's largest grasshopper.

Hercules Beetle CO-115 at Rock Creek Canyon Rd Colorado Springs, CO

Take a photo of Herkimer the hercules beetle.

"Herkimer", the monstrous West Indian Hercules Beetle, was built in the 1950's to draw attention to the May Museum of the Tropics. We don't recommend standing in its way should it be brought to life by a freak cosmic radiation storm.

Fort Sheridan Forest Preserve Near Gilgare Ln and Cliff Rd Highland Park, IL

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the amphitheater nest with three eggs.

A short hike through the woods will lead you to this oversized red-tailed hawk nest. Here you can look through the telescope in the hawk's head and learn about the bird's natural habitat.

Park in the lot at (42.2223, -87.8130) and walk to the nest.

Hidalgo Killer Bee E Texano Dr Hidalgo, TX

Take a photo of the killer bee statue.

Hidalgo marks the first known location where, in 1990, African Killer Bees crossed the border into the US. This killer bee statue was created by Jerome Vettrus of Sparta, WI. It was commissioned by the Hidalgo Economic Development Department to celebrate the invasion.


Oregon Institute of Technology Oregon Tech Library Klamath Falls, OR

Take a photo of the sculpture of geese taking flight.

The sculpture "Lakeside Manner" is located on the Oregon Institute of Technology (OIT) campus. It was completed and installed by artist Del Hodges in 1982. It is a tall, welded steel sculpture depicting a flock of Canada geese taking flight.

Kaleva Grasshopper Walta St, between Sampo Ave and Wuoski Ave Kaleva, MI

Take a photo of the grasshopper statue.

This grasshopper welded of metal junk was created by a local high school class. It is in honor of St. Urho's Day, March 16, when St. Urho drove the grasshoppers out of Finland, thus saving the grape crop. Or maybe not ... as the legend of St. Urho originated in the 1950's in Northern Minnesota where the winters are long.

Brand Park Catherine St Elmira, NY

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the commemorative bronze duck statue in Brand Park.

The last known specimen of Labrador Duck was shot, killed, and eaten on Dec 12, 1878 in Elmira, NY. The species had been thought extinct since 1875. A novice bird watcher caught wind of the catch and tried to acquire the specimen, but alas it was already dinner for the family. He was able to retrieve the duck's head and neck for identification and delivery to the National Audubon Society.

Take a photo of "Claire d'Loon".

Known as "Claire d'Loon", this statue was unveiled in May of 1981. Claire d'Loon claims to be the "World's Largest Talking Loon", although only in loon sounds.

Coachella Roadrunner Avenue 52 and Jefferson St La Quinta, CA

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the roadrunner.

This roadrunner statue landed in La Quinta in May 2015 after serving as an art installation for the Coachella Music Festival. Its job is a little easier now; it held a five-foot long porch swing from its beak during the festival.

Tom the Turkey - La Riviere Broadway St and Railway Ave La Riviere, MB

Take a photo of Tom the Turkey

Tom the Turkey was erected in 1986 for La Riviere's Centennial Celebration. It commemorates those who introduced and still promote the wild turkey in Manitoba.

Mallard Duck IA-4, south of 490th St Mallard, IA

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the Mallard statue atop the town welcome sign.

Mallard, Iowa is home to friendly ducks. Don't be an unfriendly duck.

The Milwaukee Building 618 N Water St Milwaukee, WI

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the ladybugs on the side of the Milwaukee Building.

Officially it's the Milwaukee Building, but since 1999 few have called it that. Most call it the Ladybug Building. Back in '99, the city of Milwaukee went on a beautification bender and this building was one of their pet projects.

World's Largest Mosquito Road 9E, 1/2 block south of MB-229 Komarno, MB

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the massive mosquito statue.

Komarno, MB claims the title of Mosquito Capital of the World. The name Komarno itself translates to "Mosquito" in Ukrainian.

Pete is a pelican sculpted by a student from plastic garbage and marine debris found in the coastal waterway. A nearby sign inventories a year's worth of cigarette butts, food wrappers and plastic bottles hauled out of the creek.

Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness Dodge St and N 16th St Omaha, NE

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the geese being flushed into the air out of the fountain.

This unique sculpture is officially titled "Spirit of Nebraska's Wilderness". It starts off with a wagon train, which stampedes a herd of bison, which flushes a flock of Canada geese. The geese then take off and fly into the First National Tower. The sculpture covers six city blocks and consists of over 100 pieces.



The Owl Club is the place to be Salmon, unless you're someplace else. Ask not why the owl is riddled with arrows.

Have your photo taken by IBR staff in front of the giant Prairie Chicken as part of a group.

The 9,000 pound creature was designed and built by Art Fosse as Rothsay's contribution to America's 1976 Bicentennial. A bronze plaque in front informs all that, "On June 10, 1975, Rothsay was designated Prairie Chicken Capital of Minnesota."



World's Largest Pheasant US-14 and Jersey Ave NE Huron, SD

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of The World's Largest Pheasant.

Rumor has it that this pheasant was built in 1962. It spent most of its life atop Pheasant Liquor. It has since been repainted, restored, and given a more befitting home.

Take a photo of the praying mantis

A large praying mantis, wearing glasses and reading a book, stands outside the main Jackson library.

The KokoMantis is a 22-foot long and 17-foot tall scrap art insect created by artist Scott Pitcher. The mantis torso and wings are made from WWII fuel pontoons and the legs from stop light arms.

Take a photo of the Praying Mantis.

Container Park has a huge recycled metal praying mantis that blasts flames out of its antennae at random moments in the evening. The flames can reach six stories high. If you're lucky on your arrival time, you may see the flames in action.

NOTE: We will accept a dusk/night photo of this mantis if you capture the image with the flames active.

US Coast Guard Pelican W Garden St and N Palafox St Pensacola, FL

Take a photo of the US Coast Guard pelican statue.

Pelicans in Paradise was a community art project organized by the Pensacola News Journal in 2004-05. Over 40 pelican statues were decorated by various artists and placed at various outdoor locations around downtown Pensacola. Those near the intersection of Garden and Palafox commemorate the US military branches.

Covey of Pheasants 102 Ave SW and 61st St SW Regent, ND

Daylight Hours Only

Take a photo of the pheasant sculptures.

This covey of pheasants was completed in 1998. The rooster is 60 feet long, and the hen 50 feet. Three 12-foot high chicks complete the scene

Take a photo of the roadrunner statue.

A large statue of a roadrunner stands guard at the entrance to the Angelina College campus.

Take a photo of Grip the Raven. You will find Grip on the 3rd floor of the library in the Rare Books section.

Grip was once Charles Dickens' pet raven. Upon its death Dickens had it stuffed. Grip even makes an appearance in Dickens' lesser-known story "Barnaby Rudge."

That book was reviewed by then literary critic Edgar Allan Poe. Poe wrote that "[the raven's] croaking might have been prophetically heard in the course of the drama." It wasn't long after this that Poe published his breakout work "The Raven."

Take a photo of the raven statue.

This giant raven statue is the third to reside here. The first was built in 1991 by the town volunteer fire department. That fiberglass statue, and the one that followed, were torched by vandals. The current statue was built in 1996 out of more fireretardant materials. It's hard to be a raven statue.

Take a photo of the large rooster.

A giant rooster stands outside of Lumpkin's Restaurant and Hotel in Scottsville. Why? Well this rooster needs to be somewhere and this place is as good as any.



Maman is a bronze, stainless steel, and marble sculpture created by the artist Louise Bourgeois in 1999. The sculpture, which depicts a spider, is among the world's largest, measuring over 30 ft high and over 33 ft wide. It includes a sac containing 26 marble eggs and its abdomen and thorax are made of ribbed bronze. The title is the familiar French word for Mother.

Every summer the upper Bay of Fundy plays host to massive flocks of migrating Sandpipers. From mid-July to early September, more than a quarter of a million shorebirds converge on Fundy's nutrient-rich mudflats. After fattening up, the birds will fly directly to South America without stopping. Shep, the statue, is thirteen feet long, eight feet tall, and weighs 850 pounds

Shep followed the box to the Fort Benton train depot, and watched as his master was put on board and taken away. He followed the train a short way, then came back to the station. For the next five and a half years, Shep maintained a vigil at the station, greeting the four trains that arrived each day, waiting for his master to return. Eventually, tragedy struck. On January 12, 1942, an arthritic and deaf Shep failed to hear the 10:17, then slipped on an icy rail trying to get away. Shep's obituary was carried by the major wire services, and his funeral two days later was attended by hundreds. Shep is buried on a bluff above town.

On January 31, 1961, Ham was launched from Cape Canaveral, Florida, on a suborbital flight. The capsule suffered a partial loss of pressure during the flight, but Ham's lever-pushing performance in space was only a fraction of a second slower than on Earth, demonstrating that tasks could be performed in space. Ham's capsule splashed down in the Atlantic Ocean and was recovered by a rescue ship later that day. He only suffered a bruised nose. His flight was 16 minutes and 39 seconds long.



Poetess Sarah Jospeha Hale of Newport, NH added the second 12 lines and published the poem in 1830. As a point of honor, the town of Sterling maintains that the first three stanzas of Roulston's poem were "lifted" by Hale from the Sterling kids verse.

In 1900, the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office issued a trademark for the image, which had come to be known by the title "His Master's Voice." This statue of Nipper was created in 1954 and resided on the roof of an RCA distributor in Baltimore until 1976.



A can of Moxie, the official state soda, rests on the bronze base supporting the statue and a leaping landlocked salmon, the official fish, jumps away from the moose's front hoof. Other emblems represented around the base of the statue are the official state dessert (blueberry pie), treat (whoopie pie), flower (pine cone and tassel), insect (honeybee), fossil (pertica quadrifaria), herb (wintergreen) and mineral (tourmaline), which is surrounded by a ring of nautical rope.

Reaching the trap requires roughly a 1/2 mile hike from the road on the Collins Mountain trail. At the four-way trail intersection (42.0560, -123.1363), turn left up the hill. The trap structure will be approximately 200 feet up the hill from the trail intersection.

IMPORTANT: You may not park your bike on the road at the Collins Mountain trailhead. You must park at nearby Hart-Tish Park and walk back up to the road and trailhead. In order to park, procure a day use permit from the general store down by the lake.
