Turning Home:

For most teams today was a day to head south. South from wherever. And in this year's SBR/JBR wherever has been all over the map. Yes, I know I use bad puns. But the teams really have been spread in a shotgun pattern across the U.S. Some have ventured more west and north but most have opted for the high point opportunities in the east. The dreaded traffic and cramped quarters are not great for motorcycle riding necessarily, but the bonus opportunities were relatively high and with the SBR teams enjoying the ability to string some triple point state capitol buildings together, it was just too much for some to avoid.

One lone rider, the wayward and ever moving Glenn Royal of **BoomChakaLaca** fame, left to ride on his own by former friend and teammate, Mike Hall, who had to withdraw due to illness, motored in by his lonesome to participate in the high point group photo bonus staged at the hotel. We'll see how both the seasoned rally pros and the newbies attack this opportunity. How well they do tomorrow will determine who stands at the top of the podium when the rally is over.
