Tomorrow night at the Finisher Banquet, or the Big As Texas Party as it is formally known, over 160 Iron Butt Association members will share the accomplishments these riders have earned over the last six days. This afternoon the 17 finishing teams assembled all their photo bonus records, receipts and other scoring items and made their way into the scoring room to plead their collective cases with the scorers and the Rallymaster. Some were disappointed to learn they had may a few mistakes they were unaware of.

The fun moves shortly afterward to the large ballroom in the hotel where the IBA is front and center for the night.

Yours truly, acting both as scribe and Rallymaster, will be through auditing the results of the SBR/JBR to insure we have accurate scores and the placement of the teams in the correct finishing order. Paul Meyer, who teamed this year with IBR vet and three digit SBR number holder Peter Green, appears to have well enough points to hold up under audit to reach the Finisher level. We'll also crown the first ever Chicken Challenge team winners. The two ten team member teams (confusing, right?) will be awarded their chicken medals and chicken trophies before the individual team

Finisher and 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> places awards are given out in each division. And preceding that we will be hearing from the great and legendary, Dean Tanji. I spoke with him at the group no-host happy hour and dinner tonight and I can promise you it will be a great time. We like to have fun with our final banquet and this year is going to be a good one.
